## **Doccle makes digital document management available to KBC and CBC clients**

### **KBC and CBC join the innovative Doccle platform**

**KBC and CBC have entered into a partnership with Doccle to offer a fully electronic document management system free of charge to their clients. KBC/CBC thus becomes the first Belgian financial institution to join this new platform.**

Starting in October this year, Doccle [[www.doccle.be](http://www.doccle.be)] is offering private individuals and the self-employed a personal electronic 'filing cabinet': a central supply and storage facility for digital documents from different service providers (including telecoms, health insurance funds, social-accounting secretariat, etc). Doccle users will - without charge - be able to receive, process and store their invoices, certificates and contracts, etc. in a uniform, secure and recognisable way. And this will be possible using mobile or online communication. From January 2014, KBC/CBC clients will also be able to use it to receive their administrative banking and insurance documents. KBC is thus further capitalising on the increasing digitalisation of family admin tasks, whilst at the same time decreasing paper use.

This free software offers KBC/CBC clients the great advantage of being able to place their admin docs promptly, securely and correctly in their personal digital 'filing cabinet'. No more having to go to different websites and mailboxes for an overview of their key documents. And the documents are so easily retrieved for reference or further processing. Clients no longer run the risk of mislaying a tax certificate. Insurance policies are always kept up to date. And clients avoid the paper mountain that accumulates over the years and in which the one piece of paper that is urgently needed cannot be found.

KBC/CBC clients who choose to work with Doccle after January 2014, will easily retrieve their administrative banking and insurance documents: credit contracts, loan repayment schedules, insurance policies, tax certificates, the summary of rates and charges ... they will all be in the right Doccle file drawer. Doccle informs clients whenever a new document becomes available. Doccle retains documents for as long as they are required (including legally required) for the user. But users can keep documents for longer, if they so wish.

Doccle is a document management system, not a payment system. Clients will continue to use their trusted KBC payment channels for their banking transactions. Some suppliers who are connected to Doccle will use a protected bank card payment for their invoices.

KBC clients do, however, always preserve the right to choose not to receive their documents via Doccle but via the KBC-Online message box or on paper delivered by post. Clients can also transfer their documents via another carrier, in which case they must themselves ensure that these documents are saved and stored securely.

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
